

In the right place at the right time?

So much of life's positive outcomes seem to depend on being in the right place at the right time. We've all experienced this, even in small ways. On a recent visit to Cornwall, we enjoyed lovely sunny days, but one day, in Padstow, there was a shower - and suddenly a brilliant rainbow appeared arching over the seaside harbour. We were in the right place.....

Someone whom we know, who had just moved to a new town, told us about an occasion when she lost her way simply by coming out of the station in time to catch a bus, but on the wrong side of the road. The bus took her in the opposite direction to where she wanted to go, resulting in a long tour round the neighbourhood before she realised her mistake. Right time but wrong place!

I suppose many of you may be wondering if we are 'in the right place at the right time' just now and perhaps you would rather be somewhere else!

With all that's happening just now in the Arran churches, there is a great deal of uncertainty and perhaps anxiety. We may well ask ourselves, as I have, are we in the right place at the right time? Recently I have found it difficult, being remote from the scene, to second-guess what's going on in folks' minds regarding the changes taking place. Liz Clarke and myself are fielding questions and correcting misinformation on a daily basis.

We have been going through a process of change which not everyone understands. I expect your elder has been trying to keep you up to date on what is happening.

So where do we stand right now? Having been through the stages of the Presbytery Mission Plan and agreed the Basis of Union, we have marked our newly formed Union at the service on the 1st October. I think most people would agree that it was an important milestone on our journey forward. We must continue to pray for and encourage our fellow members whose buildings are closing.

The new Kirk Session has met twice and is involved in forming working teams – Mission and Discipleship, Young People and Families, Pastoral Care, Safeguarding, Finance and Property – which will carry out the essential tasks along with the new minister and support worker. This is a work in progress and will take time to develop. With the unitary constitution of the Kirk Session, former Board members and Deacons, as well as members, are invited to join one of these teams to help the future mission of the congregation and parish. That could be you! With the gifts and talents that God has given you – your church needs you!

Are you in the right place at the right time?

At this time, the Kirk Session as a body is seeking to ensure that your name is on the electoral roll of the new congregation. Once this is authenticated by the Presbytery then a Nominating Committee will be elected by you, the members of the congregation. This committee will then seek for a minister on your behalf. That person will, God willing, be in the right place, at the right time.

Whether we are thinking of helping in a team, looking for new opportunities in our Christian life or waiting to meet someone special, it is important to be in the right place at the right time. Perhaps we sometimes envy the friends of Jesus born in his time and place, but one of the wonders of our God is that his love spans time and space. So, we can be sure that in his presence the right place is where we are, and the right time is now.

Arran Churches Together Foodbank

The Foodbank Team really appreciate all the kind donations of both food and money over the year. However, due to the cost of living crisis, we have found that there are fewer donations of food in the Co-op collection box and that the monetary donations are not buying as much food as previously. As a result, we have had to reduce the number of items which we put out in the vestibule on a daily basis. We also no longer buy all the items in the table below but only put out an item if it is donated. e.g. Household cleaning. Toilet rolls, Dog/Cat food etc. and are prioritising which food items we purchase.

The table opposite represents the number of items taken over the past year – up from last year but less than 2020-21. Numbers in red are where we have run out of stock of that particular item. The most popular items are Meat, Vegetables, Soup & Fruit.

On the 1st September 2023, when the union of Isle of Arran Church of Scotland came into effect, the finances of all the churches in the union were combined. We were also required to open a new bank account and over the next few months all bank accounts held in the names of Brodick, Corrie, Kilmory, Lamlash, Lochranza & Pirnmill, Shiskine and Whiting Bay Churches will be closed. A new bank account with the Co-operative Bank is now operating. Some information on where we are with the new parish of the Isle of Arran Church of Scotland

The parish will be served by 4 worship centres which will be know as, Brodick St Bride's, St Molios Shiskine, Whiting Bay St Donans and St Bride's Lochranza all working together to serve the Lord here on Arran.

The Kirk Session has begun the nucleus of teams to cover many aspects of the running and mission of the parish and more information on these will be forthcoming over the next weeks.

Sylvia Alison has been appointed by the Kirk Session as the Treasurer of the Isle of Arran Church of Scotland. There is also a finance team in place to oversee the churches finances.

A property team is also up and running, the Property Convenor is Alan Burnett and your contact person here at Brodick St Bride's will still be Colin McKenzie.

There will be a contact person for each of the 4 worship centres and your contact person here at St Bride's for all other matters is Shona Hume.

John Kerr has been appointed by the Kirk Session as the Roll Keeper.

The Kirk Session has appointed Sharon MacLeod as the Session Clerk and Shona Hume as deputy Session Clerk.

Working toward filling the vacancy began with the reading on the 15th October of Schedule E- Confirmation of the Electoral Register, this will be completed by the next Kirk Session meeting.

Those named on the Electoral Register will be able to nominate candidates for, and also vote in the election of a Nominating Committee – the people tasked to look for a new minister.

The roll will also be required when the congregation vote for a minister.

The next Kirk Session meeting is on the 4th November at 11am in St Bride's Brodick Hall to which all who were members of the board of Brodick Church before the union are invited. At this meeting the Presbytery Advisory Committee will attend to guide us through the next steps towards filling the vacancy.

Kirk Session meetings are open meetings for anyone to attend, you do not need to be invited. You can ask questions but only the members of the Kirk Session are allowed to vote on matters arising.

So do come along and keep up to date with what's going on in the parish, have your questions answered, and find out more about the Teams being formed.
